With abundant experience as a successful artist, illustrator, instructor and juror, he continues to honor essential concepts of beauty, design, imagination, passion and simplicity. Accomplished in watercolor, oil and pastel, he has presented painting demonstrations and workshops in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, Europe and Indonesia. He is a signature member of the American Watercolor Society (served on its Jury of Selection in New York), National Watercolor Society (served on its Jury of Selection in California) and Rocky Mountain Watermedia Society. Carl's paintings, six-times cover art and numerous articles have appeared in books and publications including American Artist, Artist's Magazine, Watercolor Magic, Splash and Pastel Journal. His paintings have received awards in national exhibitions, online competitions and plein air festivals. Carl painted in Cuba with fellow artists in Plein Air Magazine's historic Publisher's Invitational adventure. 
